Demographic and Health Surveys (IPUMS DHS) – *harmonized individual records from DHS program surveys conducted around the world* – and **International Historical Geographic Information System (IPUMS IHGIS)** – *consistently formatted tables of population and agricultural censuses around the world.*

The workshop will include a hands-on component exploring linked data from IPUMS DHS and IHGIS for an environmental health case study.
